April 4

“Navajo Rugs: The History and the Artistry” Linda Friedman, docent Tucson Museum of Art will tell the history, describe the stylish characteristics and show examples of the beauty that defines this art form which graces floors as well as walls. Each Navajo rug like its weaver is an unique individual and is an important part of Navajo tradition.

April 11

“Recovery from Fibromyalgia” Patrick Dust PhD and author of ***Finished Business*** takes the connection between psychological and physical illness to a new level, describing his personal breakthrough recovery from fibromyalgia. Patrick uses cutting-edge knowledge of the brain to connect critical issues concerning trauma and health with a nascent neuroscience of the whole person.

“Hijrah: Linking Emigration with Jihad Then and Now” Barry Webb, retired National Security Agency analyst will provide an introduction on Islam's beginnings showing scriptural examples of emigration equated with Jihad.
