March 6

“What does Transgender mean?” Diane Stein, retired Psychiatrist believes that many people are confused by the terms used by the news media such as transgender youth, trans male, trans female and gender dysphoria. She will explain transgenderism from a scientific, medical/psychiatric perspective.

March 13

“Minority Servicemembers during WWII” Les Bakke, retired from Minnesota State University as IT Director and who has been working on veteran issues since 1972, will use video clips from the Library of Congress Veterans Oral History project to present a variety of war stories from minority veterans.

March 20

“The Capture of John Dillinger in Tucson ” Alan Kruse, owner Kruse Arizona Tours will present details about the capture of the notorious John Dillinger and three of his gangster mob and their molls in Tucson with out a shot being fired. The capture took place on January 24, 1934, six months before he was finally gunned down in Chicago.

“Edward S Curtis and the North American Indian” Born in 1868 in Wisconsin, moving to Minnesota, then to Puget Sound in 1887, Edward S Curtis left behind an incredible legacy. He became a well-known photographer before deciding to relentlessly capture 40 to 50 thousand images on film and the written page the lives and traditions of 80 Indian tribes. It was a monumental 30-year task that tragically ruined him, but his spectacular work lives on.
